SDHF 2024 Affordable Housing & Community Development Conference September 10th, 2024

San Diego Housing Federation's annual *Affordable Housing & Community Development Conference* brings together more than 600 developers, builders, architects, lenders, property managers, service providers, elected and agency officials and staff, community, and business leaders to share innovative approaches to affordable housing, community, and economic development. This year, the Conference will be held at the Marriott Marquis Tuesday October 3rd. We invite you to share your expertise with us at this conference as a workshop presenter or convener.

This year's conference will focus on the topic:

Amplifying Voice, Bridging Gaps & Constructing Futures

To the degree possible, workshops should focus on responses to recent changes in the social and political environment. These include increasing housing instability for a growing number of individuals and families; addressing uncertainty of programs that have long supported affordable housing and community development; and the uneven ways in which current housing policies have a drastically different impact on communities of color. In these changing times, what forward-thinking solutions can preserve the positive impact affordable homes have on human health, families, financial mobility, children's educational outcomes, and racial equity.

Panels should include representatives with diverse backgrounds, expertise and (when appropriate) perspectives who can educate and engage attendees in a dialogue around affordable housing and community development. All proposals <u>must</u> incorporate a focus on equity and opportunity within the workshop.

For each Track, we offer ideas related to Workshop topics; however, feel free to submit proposals on other topics as well.

Track 1: Communications & Engagement

Proposals that address community organization, engagement, voter mobilization, and leadership development.

Guidelines/Requirements:

Workshops should be designed for 1 hour and 30-minute duration. You must designate the last 20 minutes of your session for Q and A.

- All workshops will be presented IN PERSON on September 10th.
 - We encourage interactive and engaging presentations with polls, surveys, photos, videos, etc.
- Moderators need to just moderate and not be one of the presenters themselves.
- No more than four total panelists (3 presenters and one moderator).
- Speakers or panelists <u>must</u> register at a reduced speaker rate if they are attending any part of the conference in addition to their workshop.
- Final Description of the workshop, all bios for speakers and moderators, and full contact list of speakers for all accepted workshops must be received by Wednesday July 31st, 2024.
- Sessions need to be well rounded and present multiple perspectives, if necessary. Sessions designed to sell or promote one company's product will <u>not</u> be accepted.

Workshop conveners will be notified of acceptance on Friday June 28th Full details and timing of the workshops will be given once the workshops have been finalized.
